

Dr Dan Pope is a Senior Lecturer in Epidemiology base at The Department of Public Health and Policy, University of Liverpool. Dan led the training workpackage for EURO-URHIS 2, an integral part of the project. Initially 3 workshops were conducted involving study partners to ensure that the UHI data collection phase of the project was conducted in optimum, scientific and standardised way. He then led 3 workshops involving policy makers and health professionals to identify the most impactful way of disseminating EURO -URHIS 2 results to influence policy and maximise health gain in EU urban areas.
